## RULES.

---

1.—That this Society be named "THE HAMPSHIRE FIELD CLUB AND ARCHÆOLOGICAL SOCIETY," and that the object of the Club be the study of the Natural History and Antiquities of the County.

2.—That the Club consist of ordinary members and honorary members.

3.—That scientific men of distinction, non-resident in the County, may be proposed and elected as honorary members of the Club at any meeting of the Committee, such honorary members not to exceed twenty-five in number.

4.—That ladies be eligible for election as members of the Club.

5.—That the annual subscription of ordinary members be seven shillings and sixpence, due in advance on the 1st January, and from new members on admission. That the names of persons newly elected be not entered on the list of members until their subscription has been paid.

6.—That the Secretary be required to give notice to members in arrear, and that the Proceedings of the Club be not sent to any whose subscription shall remain unpaid. The name of any member in arrear for one year shall be removed from the list.

7.—That the Head Quarters of the Club be at Southampton.

8.—That the government of the Club be vested in a Committee, to be elected annually, and to consist of the President, the Vice-Presidents, the Treasurer, the Editorial and general Secretaries *ex-officio*, and not less than six other members. The President, and Vice-Presidents shall not hold office for more than two years consecutively.

9.—That three be a quorum of the Committee.

10.—That the Committee be empowered to appoint Local Secretaries for any part of the County, who shall be *ex-officio* members of the Committee.

11.—That persons who are members of any recognised Scientific Society publishing proceedings, be eligible for admission as members of the Club without ballot, and that other persons having been duly proposed and seconded by two members of the Club, may be elected to the Club by the ballot of the Committee.

12.—That the proposer of any candidate be required to state the particular branch of Natural History or Antiquities in the study of which any candidate for admission into the Club is engaged, or is interested, or any other qualification, or special line of study.

13.—That in order for any such candidate to be elected a member of the Club, the ballot by the Committee be unanimous.

14.—That the Club hold not less than four ordinary field meetings in each year.

15.—That an annual meeting for general business be held in the early part of each year.

16.—That the financial report of the Club be brought up at the annual meeting in each year.

17.—That any member of a recognised Scientific Society, publishing proceedings, be eligible to attend any field meeting of the Club as a visitor, on the introduction of a member of the Club.

18.—That each member of the Club be at liberty to introduce one visitor (who may not be a member of any recognised Scientific Society) to each field meeting of the Club, but not the same visitor more than once in any one season.

19.—That members of the Club who do not attend any meeting, after they have given notice of their intention to attend, be liable for their share of any expenses which may be incurred by the Committee in connection with such meeting.

20.—That the Club discourage the practice of removing and rooting up rare plants from characteristic localities, and the extermination of rare birds, and also use its influence with landowners for their protection.

21.—That the Club use its influence to promote the preservation of objects of antiquity.

22.—That the number of members be limited to 250, but the Committee are empowered to include beyond that number persons of special attainments, or likely to promote the objects of the Club. Other candidates may be elected as vacancies occur.



## Hampshire Field Club and Archæological Society.

### ANNUAL REPORT.

*Read at Winchester, April 13th, 1905.*

The Committee in presenting their Twentieth Annual Report have, in the first place, to refer to the serious losses the Hampshire Field Club and Archæological Society have sustained during the past year.

The late Earl of Northbrook, Lord Lieutenant of the County, was, for many years, an honoured member of the Club, and continued so until his death. For the accustomed two years he served as President, and while holding office entertained the members at his seat at Stratton. His Lordship took an active interest in everything relating to the County and the objects of the Club, as well as Archæological matters generally, occupied no small share of his attention.

Mr. J. Blount Thomas, J.P., who filled the office of Hon. Financial Secretary, died on the 11th July last. Mr. Thomas was associated with the Club from its foundation, and in its earlier years when more time was at his disposal and his health better he was more active in the duties of his office and a frequent attendant at the meetings. To the last he took a warm interest in the Club, and the members have to regret the loss of an old friend and a practical scientist of no mean order.



On the 15th of January of the present year a severe loss, in some respects quite irreparable, was occasioned by the sudden death of Mr. T. W. Shore, F.G.S., virtually the founder of the Club, and from the first its genial and accomplished Organizing Secretary. It would be out of place to do more than briefly allude to the loss the Club has thus experienced. To do justice to the life work of Mr. Shore, and all that he has been to the Hampshire Field Club and Archæological Society demands a special notice and this, it is hoped, will appear in due course from the pen of the Rev. G. W. Minns, F.S.A., to accompany the publication by the Club of a memorial volume of Hampshire Collectanea from the writings of Mr. Shore. Meanwhile, the Committee have decided to enrol Dr. Lewis Erle Shore, Fellow of St. John's College, Cambridge, as a Permanent Honorary Member of the Club, and this meeting will readily accord an appreciative expression of sympathy with the family of the late much valued, and highly respected, Hon. Organizing Secretary.

In the Autumn of last year there also passed away one of the oldest members of the Club, Mr. A. H. Skelton, whose wide and thorough acquaintance with Numismatology was of immense service. Up to within a few years back he regularly attended the meetings. When his health failed he wished to resign his membership but this the Committee would not allow, and up to within a week of his death he was still at his old task of identifying Roman Coins. His loss in this particular branch of study will be greatly felt.

The post of Honorary Treasurer has been vacated by the resignation of Mr. Morris Miles one of the earliest members, and who has efficiently discharged the duties of the office since the formation of the Club. These losses and changes, while greater and more numerous than any yet experienced, are necessarily incidental to a Society, which is entering on the 21st year of its existence. The Committee have given their best attention to the contingencies which have arisen, and some proposals will be submitted for adoption by the Annual Meeting with a view to facilitate the official duties in future. With the cordial and active co-

operation of the Local Secretaries, and the support of Literary Contributors, it is hoped that the character of the Club will be maintained, and the interest and pleasure of the meetings will be undiminished.

It remains only to add that during 1904 nine meetings were held, all of them successfully carried through and well attended. They were as follow;—In Southampton, on the 19th April; in the Isle of Wight, on the 27th April; at Ellingham, Fordingbridge, and Breamore, on the 19th May; at Compton, Otterbourne, and Owslebury, on the 7th June; at Longparish, Harewood Forest, and Andover, on the 28th June; at Ringwood, Sopley, and Christchurch, on the 19th July; at Carisbrooke, and Parkhurst Forest, on the 31st August; at Southampton, on the 13th September, in connection with the Exhibition of Relics of Old Southampton, and at East Tytherley, Broughton, and King Somborne, on the 20th September. At the meeting last named the members were kindly entertained at tea by the Vicar of King Somborne, the Revd. J. H. D. Creighton.
