# PART II.—THE DELTOIDES, PYRALIDES, AND CRAMBITES.

The three groups enumerated in our present list do not meet with the attention they deserve at the hands of entomologists, though they comprise many beautiful forms, are large enough to handle easily, and are mostly not difficult to obtain. Many fly by day in the hottest sunshine, and those that do not may be easily brought out by the use of the beating-stick. Some few are very local, but the rest well distributed, and, being chiefly gregarious, may be found in plenty wherever they occur.

Old hedges will yield many species of the Deltoides and Pyralides, while old meadows and grassy hillsides are chiefly affected by the Crambites. Old chalk-pits and wet ditches should not be neglected, and trunks of trees searched during May for the Eudoreidæ; nor should bogs and marshes be forgotten, as they yield species not found elsewhere.

The British list numbers about one hundred and sixty in these families, and of this number one hundred and six have been found in Hampshire. In cases of doubt or difficulty as to times of appearance or food plant, reference has been made to Stainton's Manual—a book much to be recommended.
