MEMBERSHIP.

Members of any recognised kindred Society, publishing Proceedings, are eligible for admission as Members of the Club without ballot; other persons must be proposed and seconded by two Members of the Club (Rules 11, 12, 13).

It has been found necessary to limit the number of Members to 250, but the Committee are empowered to include beyond that number, persons of special attainments, or likely to promote the objects of the Club (Rule 22). Other candidates will be admitted as vacancies occur.

WITHDRAWAL.

Any member wishing to withdraw must signify his intention in writing previous to January 1st, otherwise he will be considered liable to pay his subscription for the year, beginning on that day.

SUBSCRIPTIONS.

The Subscription (7s. 6d. yearly) becomes due in advance on the 1st of January, and from New Members on admission (Rule 5).

RULES.

1.—That this Society be named "THE HAMPSHIRE FIELD CLUB AND ARCHÆOLOGICAL SOCIETY," and that the object of the Club be the study of the Natural History and Antiquities of the County.

2.—That the Club consist of ordinary members and honorary members.

3.—That scientific men of distinction, non-resident in the County, may be proposed and elected as honorary members of the Club at any meeting of the Committee, such honorary members not to exceed twenty-five in number.

4.—That ladies be eligible for election as members of the Club.

5.—That the annual subscription of ordinary members be seven shillings and sixpence, due in advance on the 1st January, and from new members on admission. That the names of persons newly elected be not entered on the list of members until their subscription has been paid.

6.—That the Secretary be required to give notice to members in arrear, and that the Proceedings of the Club be not sent to any whose subscription shall remain unpaid. The name of any member in arrear for one year shall be removed from the list.

7.—That the Head Quarters of the Club be at Southampton.

8.—That the government of the Club be vested in a Committee, to be elected annually, and to consist of the President, the Vice-Presidents, the Treasurer, the Editorial and general Secretaries *ex-officio*, and not less than six other members. The President, and Vice-Presidents shall not hold office for more than two years consecutively.

9.—That three be a quorum of the Committee.

10.—That the Committee be empowered to appoint Local Secretaries for any part of the County, who shall be *ex-officio* members of the Committee.

11.—That persons who are members of any recognised Scientific Society publishing proceedings, be eligible for admission as members of the Club without ballot, and that other persons having been duly proposed and seconded by two members of the Club, may be elected to the Club by the ballot of the Committee.

XIII.

12.—That the proposer of any candidate be required to state the particular branch of Natural History or Antiquities in the study of which any candidate for admission into the Club is engaged, or is interested, or any other qualification, or special line of study.

13.—That in order for any such candidate to be elected a member of the Club, the ballot by the Committee be unanimous.

14.—That the Club hold not less than four ordinary field meetings in each year.

15.—That an annual meeting for general business be held in the early part of each year.

16.—That the financial report of the Club be brought up at the annual meeting in each year.

17.—That any member of a recognised Scientific Society, publishing proceedings, be eligible to attend any field meeting of the Club as a visitor, on the introduction of a member of the Club.

18.—That each member of the Club be at liberty to introduce one visitor (who may not be a member of any recognised Scientific Society) to each field meeting of the Club, but not the same visitor more than once in any one season.

19.—That members of the Club who do not attend any meeting, after they have given notice of their intention to attend, be liable for their share of any expenses which may be incurred by the Committee in connection with such meeting.

20.—That the Club discourage the practice of removing and rooting up rare plants from characteristic localities, and the extermination of rare birds, and also use its influence with landowners for their protection.

21.—That the Club use its influence to promote the preservation of objects of antiquity.

22.—That the number of members be limited to 250, but the Committee are empowered to include beyond that number persons of special attainments, or likely to promote the objects of the Club. Other candidates may be elected as vacancies occur.

ANNUAL REPORT.

Read at Winchester, May 1st, 1908.

Since the last Annual Meeting several well-known members of the Club have passed away, and the Committee chronicle their loss with deep regret.

The Right Hon. Evelyn Ashley always took a warm interest in the affairs of the Club. For two years he served as Vice-President, and on one occasion kindly and hospitably received the members at Broadlands. Sir Henry Clarke Jervoise, Bart., of Idsworth Park, was also an old member of the Club, though not an attendant at its meetings.

By the death, quite recently, of Mr. Morris Miles, the Club has lost one of its oldest members associated with it from the foundation. In conjunction with Mr. Ernest Westlake, he was one of the first secretaries. Twenty-one years ago on the appointment of the present Hon. General Secretary he became Treasurer, and filled the office until three years ago. He also served as a Vice-President.

Familiar faces that will also be missed are those of the Rev. W. Gaisford Bourne, D.D., Rector of North Baddesley, and Miss Child, of Winchester.

The attendance at these meetings was very varied. At some so many attended as to cause considerable trouble in providing for their accommodation. At others the numbers were disappointing, notably at the meeting to see the Roman Villa at Stroud. This excursion arranged at great trouble and cost, was attended by only about 15 people. This is probably an indication that fewer meetings at wider intervals will be more acceptable.

The members were hospitably entertained by Sir William Portal Bart., and Lady Portal, at Laverstoke House; by Mr. and Mrs. H. L. Hansard, at Stanbridge Earls; and by the Rev. A. A. Headley and Mrs. Headley, at Alresford Rectory. To all of these the Committee tender their best thanks.

The first part of the "Shore Memorial Volume" has been issued to members. Its publication and the printing of the "Papers and Proceedings" for the year 1907—a part of somewhat larger dimensions than usual—has cost more than was anticipated. The demands on the funds of the Club cause some anxiety to the Honorary Treasurer, who appeals to our friends for a little extra help to enable him to meet liabilities.
