THE ROMANESQUE FACADE OF WINCHESTER CATHEDRAL: CORRECTIONS AND ADDITIONS

This note is to comment on an aspect of J Crook and Y Kusaba's article in the volume Winchester Cathedral: Nine Hundred Years (1993), which appeared after Part I of my article on the cathedral had gone to press (McAleer 1993). I was not in fact made aware of the volume until after Part II (McAleer 1994) had been prepared for publication, hence this additional comment. I do not see or agree that there are 'vestiges of an intended opening from the stair turrets of the work attributed to Bishop Edington] on to the aisle roofs' (Crook & Kusaba 1993, 223, fig. 16.8). Because the opening from the inner wall of the stair vice has not been constructed with the vice but, rather, clearly has been broken through at a later date, as has the following passageway through the core of the (Romanesque) wall, it would make little sense to have made the beginnings of a doorway on the exterior when there was nothing to which it could relate.

I would also like to draw the attention of readers to a few typographical errors in McAleer (1994) which slightly alter or confuse my meaning:
